Superintendent's Corner



Wow, winter decided to come in full force in March, and it definitely came in like a lion. As of this writing, we still have one snow day left for the 2022-2023 school year, but we all know that April can be unpredictable in the North Country. I am sure I am not alone in hoping that spring weather is in our future.

Update on where we are on the merger conversation.

So. last I wrote, both Minerva and Johnsburg's Boards of Education had agreed to do a merger feasibility study. The two districts have asked our BOCES District Superintendent, Dr. Turina Parker, to submit a Request for Proposals (RFP) on our behalf. Agencies will respond with their plan on how they would perform this study, as well as the cost. After we receive these proposals, both schools will sit down and review each proposal and decide which one best fits our needs and costs. We anticipate that the actual study will start in September of 2023. I have been informed that other schools in our area that have done these studies in the past were asked to compile a team made up of specific members. I know one group will consist of community members. If you are interested in sitting on this creative team, please let me know. It does appear that there will be a somewhat demanding time commitment, and I think it will last for the entire school year, but the importance of this decision is worth it. As I have a better understanding of the timeline, I will let you know.

End of 3rd Quarter

The end of the third quarter is a make-or-break time of year for some students. This is when a student that has not been doing well needs to buckle down and work harder to pass the year, or the student that hasn't been failing but not doing well needs to make sure they don't fall below passing. Johnsburg Central School is proud to announce the selection of Caroline Williams from its music program that will perform at the 2023 Eastern Division Honors Festival held in Rochester, NY April 13-16.

The event is sponsored by the National Association for Music Education (NAfME) and hosted by the New York State School Music Association (NYSSMA). Miss Williams will be among the more than two hundred (200) students selected from school music programs across

the state. Approximately seven hundred (700) students will participate from schools across the east coast. Caroline represents the top 1% of NYSSMA Vocalists in New York State.

Students will rehearse and perform with renowned conductors including Dr. James Tapia of Syracuse University (All Eastern Symphonic Band); Rachel Lauber of the Eastman Community Music School and University at Buffalo (All Eastern Symphony Orchestra); Jason

Max Ferdinand of the University of Maryland (All Eastern Mixed Chorus); Brian Powell of Montclair State University, NJ (All Eastern Modern Band); Dr. Kristina MacMullen of University of North Texas (All Eastern Treble Chorus); and jazz tubist Bob Stewart conducting the All Eastern Jazz Ensemble.

"This is a wonderful opportunity for our students," said Katy Ashe, Caroline's vocal instructor. "They will work collaboratively with other young musicians from schools outside of New York and gain valuable experience by working with renowned master Conductors."


