Feasibility Study

The Feasibility Committee met on January 31st. at Johnsburg Central School. This meeting's main focus was the future use of the two existing school buildings as well as transportation. While many ideas were discussed, the committee agreed on several options to explore in more detail. For example, one proposed option was using only one school building for all students. The group ultimately did not support this idea. Most members thought the best option was to use Johnsburg as a Pre-K through 4th grade and 9th through 12th grade building. All 5th through 8th grade students would be in the Minerva building. A sub-committee was created to explore this option in more detail. This group will report to the entire committee at the next meeting, scheduled for March 6th at Minerva at 6:30 pm.

During a review of both districts' transportation programs, it quickly became apparent that keeping the bus runs very similar to what they are now, with shuttles between the two schools after all students have been picked up, is the best option. The two districts are less than 10 minutes apart, making it a very short trip between the two buildings.

The group also discussed the possibility of operating a private daycare program in the

Minerva School building. This daycare would be open to both communities and help with childcare needs.

The anticipated last meeting for the feasibility study committee will be held at Johnsburg on Wednesday, March 13th, at 6:30 pm. After these next two meetings, CASDA will write up their report and have it reviewed by the State to ensure all aspects of a merger have been included. CASDA will present its findings to both school boards of education. Each school's board must decide whether to present it to both communities for the "Straw" vote. Before this vote, I will hold meetings to inform the Johnsburg community about the study and what the Feasibility committee has recommended. The Straw vote may likely happen sometime in June or July. 

Incoming Prekindergarten at JCS

Please call Laurie West in the main office at 518-251-2921 to register your child for pre-k. After you call, you will be sent a packet of information to fill out and return to the guidance office. Your child will be placed on a list indicating whether you prefer an AM or PM session, if it becomes necessary to have two sessions of pre-k. We cannot guarantee that your child will be placed in the session that you prefer. Placement will be determined by a first come, first-served basis. Please fill out and return your packets as soon as possible.

Incoming Kindergarten at JCS

If your child(ren) will be 5 years old prior to December 1, 2024, they are eligible to attend kindergarten during the 2024-2025 school year. If your child currently attends pre-k at JCS, your child will be automatically registered for kindergarten. If your child is not currently enrolled in pre-k at JCS, please call Laurie West in the main office at 518-251-2921 as soon as possible.







Looking ahead to next year:

- Students going into grade 7 are required by NYS law to have their Meningitis vaccine.
- Students going into grade 12 are required by NYS law to have their 2nd Meningitis vaccine.
- Students entering grades PK, Kindergarten, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11 require a physical within 12 months of the upcoming school year.

Please pack extra clothes for your child(ren) in at least grades PK-3 in case of unforeseen needs.

Please also remember to pack healthy snacks and water bottles for your kids, especially if staying after for sports/clubs.

Congratulations to all the athletes for all their hard work over the last few months.


Also, thank you to all of our coaches for all of their hard work and dedication to the teams and programs during the winter season!
