Last month, my news article in the Jottings was a copy of the letter I sent to the Minerva Central School Board of Education inquiring if they were interested in doing a joint study on the possibility of the two schools merging. I have heard back from them, and they are interested and would like to move forward. I contacted our BOCES District Superintendent, Dr. Turina Parker, and she is helping us find the appropriate person to host our first discussion with both Boards of Education.

At this initial meeting, the two Boards will have the opportunity to ask questions and gather information. We want to allow the public to come and listen to the process.

The public should also have the opportunity to ask questions and have them


answered. Therefore, we would like to set up options for this to happen. Here are a few we will be creating.

- We are putting a drop box in a few places for people to write questions or comments. We will have one box set up at the school's front door, one at every Board meeting, and one for students to access by the principal office.
- We are hosting a "Coffee with Mike" every morning after a Board meeting (usually Tuesdays) to answer questions on any topic connected with the

school, including the process we are going through with the merger study.

 There will also be opportunities for the public to attend Board meetings for public comments during visitor comments. And most importantly, the public will be able to vote on the merger if it gets that far in the process.

This process needs and will be transparent. If you ever feel that you need additional information, give me a call.


**Canned Food Drive**

I am happy to report we have had very few COVID-19 cases so far this year.
